MONDAY MORNINGS: As Monday mornings will be busy with new information, finalizing payments, selling t-shirts, etc; we ask that you plan to bring your child to camp early. Monday morning drop-off is from 8am-8:30am.

CLOSINGS: Summer Camp will be closed on July 4-5. July 1 will be a half-day of camp. Pick-up on July 1 is at 12:30pm.

Payment Methods: The accepted forms of payment for the summer camp programs are cash, checks, money orders, credit cards, and debit cards (Visa, Discover, American Express, and MasterCard). Please make all checks and money orders payable to Bethany Christian School. Check payments are only accepted up to two weeks prior to the start of each camp session.

Registration fee: There is a one-time per "camp year" \$30 registration fee for each child.

Enrollment fee: The enrollment fee for our camps is \$145 per week (unless otherwise noted). All deposits are non-refundable and/or non-transferable and payable to Bethany Christian School. A \$75 non-refundable deposit is required to process any registration for each camp your child plans to attend. This deposit is applied to the total weekly fee. The balance for each week is due two weeks in advance. Payments for any program made after this due date could be charged with additional fees or the registration could be forfeited all together. All returned checks will incur a \$30 processing fee. Any bank draft payments returned with non-sufficient funds will incur a \$30 processing fee.

Camp Policies & Procedures

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Extended Hours Price: Extended camp hours are designed for campers who are enrolled in programs from 8:30am-3:00pm but need to be dropped off before 8:30am and/or picked up after 3:00pm. Before care (7:00am-8:30am) costs \$40 per camper, per week or \$20 per camper, per day. After care (3:20pm-6:00pm) costs \$60 per camper, per week or \$30 per camper, per day. You may purchase these services separately. If both before and after care are needed, the price is \$75 per week. We close promptly at 6:00pm. There will be a mandatory \$1 per minute per camper fee for all campers remaining past the 6:00pm camp closing time.

Cancellations: BCS Summer Camp holds the right to close registration for programs that are filled or under-enrolled. If a camp session is closed due to a natural disaster, safety, or weather-related issues, there will be no refunds offered. Depending on the specific circumstances of a closure, camp program vouchers may be issued and used at a later date.

Required Summer Camp T-shirts: All campers are required to purchase at least one BCS Summer Camp T-shirt. Camp T-shirts must be worn on a daily basis for safety reasons. Shirts are \$10 each and will be available for purchase when you come to camp. Additional T-shirts may be purchased for your convenience.

Lunch/Snacks: Campers must bring their own non-perishable lunch and beverage to camp daily. Campers also must bring a morning and afternoon snack. However, campers will visit our Snack Shop daily where various snack foods may be purchased.
